Almost certain (expected to occur in most circumstances)	H	H	E	E	E	HIERARCHY OF CONTROLS (in order of effectiveness): Elimination: elimination of the risk is the first option to be considered and the most effective.
Likely (probably occur in most circumstances)	M	H	H	E	E	Substitution: where an item that presents the hazard is replaced by an alternative item that does the same job, but is a lower risk.
Moderate (could occur at some time)	L	M	H	E	E	Isolation: is used to isolate the hazard from individuals.
Unlikely (not likely to occur, but possible)	L	L	M	H	E	Engineering: changing the process and/or equipment to reduce the risk.
Rare (may occur only in exceptional circumstances)	L	L	M	H	H	Administrative: includes implementing procedures, rosters, and providing training.
